


**Instrucciones:**

**Gaelic Football**

Gaelic Football is a team sport that is very famous in Ireland. It is a combination of "rugby" and "football / soccer".

At first it looks like normal football, but when you see that a player can get the ball with his or her hands, you realize this is a different sport. Then, the player usually runs to the H-shaped goal carrying the ball and trying to avoid the rivals.

There are two teams. Each one of them has fifteen players. The match lasts for sixty minutes, divided into two halves of thirty minutes.

The ball looks like a volleyball, but it's heavier than a football. The field is similar to a rugby field: it is bigger than a football field and there are more lines in order to indicate the different areas. The goals are H-shaped because a player can score goals in two different ways: introducing the ball inside the goal (3 points) and also making the ball pass over the crossbar (and between the masts, 1 point).



Some rules: players have to hold the ball with just one hand, not with two hand, because this is fault. And



they can't change the ball from hand to hand either. Players have to bounce the ball every four steps, but only once. When defending, a player can't block a shot with his or her legs.

There are eight professional teams of Gaelic Football in Spain. The closest one in Seville, if you want to try it.
